A MESSAGE FROM OUR TEMPLE PRESIDENT

As we gather to welcome the Jewish New Year, I am filled with gratitude for the unity and strength within our Temple Beth-El community.

This past year has been particularly challenging with the horrific attacks on Israel, the rise in anti-Semitism, the protests on college campuses and in our cities, and all while more than 100 hostages are still being held captive as I write this. We have experienced and felt many moments of fear and uncertainty, but we have also witnessed the power of coming together as a community. In facing adversity, we have supported one another, spoken out against injustice and reaffirmed our commitment to the values that make us who we are.

As we enter this season of reflection, I encourage each of us to focus on the resilience that has carried the Jewish people through trying times. Our tradition reminds us that from darkness, we can find light; and from hardship, we can draw strength. The High Holidays provide an opportunity to renew our commitment to these ideals and to each other.

In Pirkei Avot 1:14, we learn, “If I am not for myself, who will be for me? And, if I am for myself alone, then what am I? And, if not now, when?” Now, more than ever, it is important and perhaps even critical to lean into the power of community, prayer and introspection.

How might one do that? Our mission, which is reiterated in our vivid vision—found on our TBE website—is to support our members in defining and being our authentic Jewish selves. We pursue this mission by offering our members opportunities for meaningful engagement with the five pillars of the Jewish tradition:

Torah—stimulating Jewish learning for people of all ages that transforms the way we see and live in the world.
Avodah—traditional and modern worship, enhanced by the joy of music, that meet the diverse spiritual needs of 21st-century Jews.

G'milut Chasadim—acts of kindness, caring and social action that touch our congregants' lives and make our wider community a better place.

Kehillah—social and cultural activities that build community and give our members a feeling of belonging.

Israel—recognizing the special relationship among Jews throughout the world, along with the unique and essential bond that we share with the State of Israel.

We hope and encourage you to reaffirm your connection to TBE through attending Torah study, joining us at Shabbat and other worship services, participating in one of our many volunteer and tzedakah opportunities, signing up for one of our social events and by helping us support our Jewish homeland. You can find a plethora of these and other activities in our robust program guide, *Horizons*.

During these Days of Awe, I invite each of you to immerse yourself in the High Holidays services and programs, engage deeply with the prayers and reflections, and connect with one another in meaningful ways. Together, we can rise above the challenges and reaffirm the enduring spirit of our people.

May this new year bring healing to those who are hurting, comfort to those who feel alone and a renewed sense of hope to all of us. May we find strength and courage in the year ahead, and may we continue to shine as a light in the world. *G'mar chatima tovah*—may we be inscribed and sealed in the Book of Life.
